


Catholic Charities and its member agencies will continue in its outreach to serve communities, knowing that Our Lord Jesus Christ is with us always.

Pope Francis calls us to a personal change of heart and a collective transformation that responds to "both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor."

-Encyclical Laudato Si

In his landmark encyclical, Laudato Sí, "On Care for Our Common Home", Pope Francis issues an "urgent challenge to protect our common home...to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change".

While the earth is our "common home", it is clear that we are damaging our relationship with it, harming the environment. In so doing, we are also damaging our relationship with those around us, especially the most vulnerable in our society.

We and the earth are interconnected. We depend on everyone exercising good stewardship and when they do not the result is environmental degradation and climate change. Ecological health is interwoven with social well-being. We 'hear' the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor.

Reverence for nature is linked with compassion for people. A purely materialistic disregard for the environment also undermines the worth of human life, especially those seen as having little usefulness – human embryos, the poor, people with developmental disabilities.

A profit-driven consumerism results in exploitation: a throwaway attitude toward nature and human life.

Awareness of the interconnectedness of creation is essential to understanding environmental degradation on "cultural ecology". Social networks and communities bound to the environment are threatened. Look at the experience of indigenous peoples.

We need to take action to bring about positive change. Individuals, families and communities, can make a difference in small yet significant ways. We need to make choices, reduce wastefulness, and not be afraid to change our lifestyle. We need to take steps toward a deeper, spiritual "ecological conversion".

"God created the world, writing into it an order and a dynamism that human beings have no right to ignore," says Pope Francis in Laudato Sí. Every creature has in its nature an end, which humans must respect and honour. The "ultimate purpose of other creatures is not to be found in us" but rather in the Risen Christ who embraces all things".
