





A snapshot of our services




Face to Face Counselling for families, children, youth and adults.

Supporting young families

Susan was 17 years old when she became pregnant. Her family had a hard time accepting the pregnancy. But Susan had a deep commitment to her unborn child and their future. She started attending counselling sessions at Rose of Durham, a program offering support and educational services for young pregnant women, young parents, and their children.

Susan met regularly with a Rose of Durham counsellor until shortly after her son was born. Recently she called to inform Rose of Durham staff that she and her son are happy and healthy. She has completed college and will be attending university in September of this year. After a year of no contact, Susan called her family and worked to resolve their issues so that she and her son have their support. The father of her son sees him regularly and they are co-parenting.

Building Confidence

Stella confided to staff at Loyola Arrupe that she was in an abusive relationship. Loyola Arrupe Centre provides programs and services promoting healthy living.

The staff listened to her, supported her, and provided referrals. They also engaged her in volunteer work because she felt trapped in her apartment with her husband.

The volunteer work boosted Stella's self-esteem, and increased her social network. She became Volunteer of the Month for the work she did at the centre. She was very proud to be a volunteer, requesting a picture of herself at the annual volunteer appreciation party to send to relatives in the old country. She tells us it feels good to be useful and needed, and that the volunteer work becomes positive proof of her worth that counteracts abusive messages from husband.

Stella is aware that people do care about her and think well of her, and we keep her in mind when we have perks such as free daytrips to give away to volunteers, since she's also on an extremely limited income. She has been invited to participate in more activities and has also joined one of our fitness classes in order to build her social network even more. Stella no longer comes to us crying, but smiles when she sees us.

Fostering Communication

After receiving cochlear implants, Jason attended speech therapy for years, but was unable develop his speech. His family tried to find support from medical experts, and eventually Jason was referred to Silent Voice, an organization serving deaf adults, children and their families.

The initial contact with Silent Voice was brief. The family was hesitant to learn ASL (American Sign Language) because they had been warned that learning ASL would impair their son's ability to speak. But, left with a frustrated child, and no real communication at home, they reluctantly enrolled Jason at a school where ASL is the primary language.

Within a few short weeks, the family realized that Jason was making good progress in school, and had picked up the language quite naturally. They contacted Silent Voice again, to register for in-home sign language classes. The family is now starting to accept Jason's deafness as they share a common language base. Jason is participating in the Silent Voice summer camp program.

A Message from the President



While 2007 was challenging, we accomplished much through actions that helped make our member agencies even more efficient and effective and that were marked by accountability and transparency. Here are some of our accomplishments:

We united North and South Simcoe Catholic Family Services into one dynamic agency that will provide the Simcoe community with a greater level of service.

Through our Social Justice and Advocacy Committee, we developed an Ontario 2007 Election Kit, emphasizing the need for more affordable and supportive housing and an end to unacceptable levels of poverty, especially among children.

We launched Four Winds Camp on Lake Simcoe – formerly Columbus Boys' Camp – to give disadvantaged boys 6 to 14 a great summer escape that will continue into 2008.

Our Membership Review team helped member agencies to reflect in their work in the light of Gospel values and the

Church. Our Allocations team worked diligently to provide funds for programs. We redressed an agencies' staff Pension shortfall and strengthen agencies through a mentoring program. We also initiated our strategic planning process.

We brought together organizations in a Refugee Roundtable to examine problems facing refugees who turn to Canada for support and how we could develop a cooperative and consistent approach.

All this was done through the commitment and dedication of our volunteer Board. Special thanks go to our Board, Archbishop Thomas Collins; Executive Director Michael Fullan for his leadership and proactive approach; and, the staff of Catholic Charities who make us all look so good.

Serving as Board President for the past two years has given me a great sense of satisfaction and fulfillment about the actions we took to make a positive difference in the lives of those who turn to Catholic Charities for support.
