

From 2002 to 2011, Catholic Charities invested almost \$8.5 million from ShareLife in services provided by its member agencies and for grants to support families, individuals and groups. Funds have not kept pace with the need that grows sharply each year.

CATHOLIC FAMILY SERVICES PEEL-DUFFERIN Managing conflict and moving forward

Newly separated and in her mid-40's, Mary* walked into the offices of Catholic Family Services of Peel-Dufferin (CFSPD), a Catholic Charities member agency, seeking support for her and teenage daughter, Julie. She said her ex-husband abused her, verbally and emotionally, and neglected their daughter.

Julie was experiencing distress during visits with her father and his new family. She was using substances to cope and Mary struggled with an illness made worse by the stress.

CFSPD's mission is to strengthen individual, family and community life consistent with Catholic social teaching and the inherent dignity of the human person and the sanctity of life.

With CFSPD counselling, Mary and Julie* learned how to communicate better, make time to share with each other and manage conflict. They developed the skills to calm themselves and reflect on their behaviour and attitudes toward each other.

A Social Return on Investment

Catholic Charities' member agencies meet the growing need in our communities and invest in new and innovative ideas, bringing positive social return for everyone.

As the need grows in communities throughout Ontario, Catholic Charities' member agencies are finding new ways to meet those needs. Meeting those needs is a real investment in our communities with economic as well as social benefits.

Catholic Charities' agencies provide counselling assistance to families, help young parents, assist seniors, aid children and help youth in transition to a new and better life. They work with people who have special needs such as those who live with developmental disabilities and the deaf community.

In addition to the many social benefits, how do Catholic Charities' member agencies benefit our local and provincial economies? Let's listen to what Silent Voice Canada, a Catholic Charities member agency, tells us about their programs for deaf children, youth, adults and their families.

Their Settlement Program offers hearing impaired and deaf new immigrants information about daily life in Canada with the only deaf settlement worker in Canada. Among the things new immigrants learn is how to find a doctor to treat non-urgent medical needs rather than always go to a hospital emergency room. The cost to the community for an emergency room visit is about \$231, while the cost to Silent Voice is just \$111. While the social benefit is assumed, the economic benefit is often overlooked.

Social services create a positive social return on investment. They make life better for thousands of families and individuals but also truly benefit Ontario's economy by saving money. In these tough economic times, that's very good news.

PROVIDENCE HEALTHCARE


"It's all good - very good."




Volunteer Hours 2010 / Member Agencies

"I want to help people the way they helped me."

Here is what one young parent said about how she was helped by Rose of Sharon, a Catholic Charities member agency that offers support services and programs for young mothers in York Region.

It's hard enough to be a parent with all the demands of a newborn: sleepless nights, diaper changing, midnight feedings. Now imagine doing all that at sixteen, while going to school and working part time... *I did*.

As a teenager, I rebelled when my parents separated. It was tough. My mother drank and wasn't there for me emotionally. My father was my "rock"... more the parent; my mother more my friend. I felt so angry at everything. By fifteen, I was pregnant. At sixteen, I gave birth to my son. It was a scary time, but my son gave me a reason to do better in my life.

The love and support I found at Rose of Sharon gave me confidence to believe in myself and move forward. I'm married with another beautiful son. My husband and I started our own business. My relationship with my mother grows each day. I'm now at Seneca College, pursuing my dream of becoming a social worker to help people the way I've been helped!
